- Fun fact: I've attended 4 different Girl Scout Camps and worked at 2!






The Problem

*Youth are the largest voting block

4 million new voters graduate HS every year, 87% eligible to register or vote

Youth have the lowest turnout in elections

Low-income voters are **half as likely** to vote







~90%

of seniors are eligible to register to vote by the time they graduate



40%

voted in 2020

1 in 5

young people who didn't register to vote had difficulty registering.

Either they didn't know how to register, missed the deadline, or had trouble with their application.

As a result, youth issues are deprioritized:












Minnesota Voting Information

- In-person at voting location on Election Day: Nov 5 close of polls
- Online: By 11:59 PM on Oct 15
